Spring, where has the year gone.

Mildura airport continues to be the dynamic operation it has become since corporatisation in 2009.

We are moving ahead rapidly with the finalisation of the detailed design of the runway overlay and extension and expect to invite formal tenders for construction within the next few weeks.

This will be a major project by any definition and we will import approximately 40,000 tonnes of crushed rock and bitumen for the overlay alone.

A construction site will be established on the airport grounds, material will be stockpiled and an asphalt batching plant will be constructed to mix asphalt material for the overlay.

With Spring officially here, we are approaching the end of our tree planting programme for the Airport grounds and have planted in excess of 500 new trees and shrubs, carefully selected to provide a food source for small birds and bees that are important to the environment.

We have also seen improvements made to the traffic flow into the terminal precinct with the installation of a new round about.

Plans are coming together for a full Airport emergency exercise that will be held at the end of September.

That's all for spring, till next time.

Some updates from Mildura Airport



Design development of the runway overlay project is progressing in accord with the programme that supported the successful application for Federal funds for the project.

The federal government's grant of \$10m was approved in December 2015 and with co-funding contribution from Mildura Rural City Council and Mildura Airport Corporation, will enable Mildura Airport to complete a bitumen overlay of 150 mm over the existing runway.

This overlay is a structural enhancement to the existing pavement to ensure that Mildura can accommodate the heavier "Code C" (Boeing B 737-800 and Airbus A 320) aircraft in increasing numbers over the projected life of the runway.

In conjunction with the runway works, the apron will be improved, Taxiway Charlie strengthened and Taxiway Delta reconstructed.

Mildura Airport chief executive Bill Burke said.

In recent months Mildura Airport has advertised for Expressions of interest for parties to undertake the construction work.

Given the need to maintain operations of the runways, the overlay operation will be conducted at night allowing the runway to reopen in the early hours of the morning, therefore removing disruptions to airlines and passengers.

The Mildura Airport Team are pleased with the progress of the project and are looking forward to seeing works commence on site in the near future.

Mildura Chocolate Company products are also available from 4 Bothroyd Court, Sunraysia Cellar Door, Stefano's Café and online.



The Wentworth 2016 Tractor Rally commemorates the sixtieth anniversary of the great flood that occurred in 1956 at Wentworth, when at the junction of the two rivers, including the Mighty Murray and the Darling, that flooded and threatened the town of Wentworth.

As a result, many local farmers rallied with their "little grey Fergies" to build and strengthen the levee banks which ultimately saved the town from the flood waters

Hundreds of tractors travelled to Wentworth in early July including Adrian Hem with his 1964 J3 Bedford tray truck and 1950 Ferguson (Fergie) tractor.

Adrian left from his home town Kilmore, Victoria with a good mate Robert and headed for Wentworth on Wednesday July 6th 2016.

Their first stop was Swan Hill, then on to Redcliffs for the second evening to commence the tractor rally the next morning.

Whilst at Redcliffs they were very impressed with the remarkable Big Lizzie, that was an attraction to them due to their passion for Australian historical machinery. Adrian stating this is truly a "Big Beast".

Friday morning came the commencement of the tractor rally they leaving Redcliffe's early on the first of two tractor treks.

Adrian decided it was a good idea to start with his Fergie on the truck as he had been experiencing water pump trouble.

The first trek included over 200 Fergies travelling from Redcliffs to Wentworth having stopped on the way for morning tea and lunch.

The second days treked them through NSW for an 80 kms trip stopping for morning tea and lunch that was provided along the way.

Totalling a 280 km for the total rally.

With the completion of the rally Sunday, Monday was the 450 km trip home to Kilmore, which is not all that easy in a J3 Bedford truck but this wasn't started without stopping off at The 'Mildura Airport' to take a look, having heard about many improvements that had been made since Adrian's last visit in years prior.

I had not seen the Airport for years and what a pleasant surprise to see how the recent developments had transformed this old lady into a modern regional airport with every conceivable convenience.
